Shebeens were born during the period when the apartheid government denied African people the right to consume liquor unless they could prove they had passed 10 years of schooling. They might then apply for a permit for no more than six bottles of beer and a bottle of spirits a month. This action saw shebeens formed by professional bootleggers. In 1988, shebeens were granted licenses to sell liquor and are now run as taverns and nightclubs.

**Shebeen (An African restaurant)**

A shebeen is an “unlicensed pub”. Shebeens were born during the period when the apartheid government denied African people the right to consume liquor unless they could prove that they had passed 10 years of schooling. They might then apply for a permit for no more than six bottles of beer and a bottle of spirits a month. This action saw shebeens formed by professional bootleggers. In 1988, shebeens were licensed and are now run as taverns and nightclubs.

- Drive through the up market suburb of Houghton via Munro Drive past the St. Johns College. Stop at Northwards for a view of the affluent northern suburbs of Johannesburg.
- Visit Constitution Hill, the new home of our Constitutional Court, the protector of our basic rights and freedom. Constitution Hill is also the notorious site of the old Fort prison complex where thousands prisoners were brutally punished before the dawn of our democracy in '94. Many of South Africa's celebrities like Mr. Mandela and Mohatma Ghandi were imprisoned here.
- Drive through the trendy Hillbrow.
- Stop at the Top of Africa for a view of the city. Visit the traditional healers market and then drive through New Town.

**INTRODUCTION** : Born as a small agricultural hamlet on the Apies River (literally translated, this means the same as "monkey river") Pretoria has been the Administrative Capital of South Africa since 1910. Also known as "Jacaranda City," it shall be a unique experience, that comprises of picturesque garden suburbs and Embassies.

**DEPARTURE** : Morning Tour - between 08:00 and 09:00

#### ITINERARY

- **Union Buildings** – with its imposing colonnades, this occupies a commanding position on Meintjieskop, east of the city. The Union Building overlooks Pretoria, the Administrative Capital of the Republic of South Africa. Considering its history and symbolism, no other building in Pretoria could be more suitable to house the Office of the State President, of the Republic of South Africa.
- **Church Square** – In the heart of the city is Church Square with its statue of Paul Kruger. Clustered around the Square, are several historic buildings, built in the late 1880's and 1890's. Among them are the impressive Palace of Justice, the Raadsaal (House of Parliament) the State Bank and Mint. You will embark from your vehicle at Church Square and be taken on a guided tour of the Square. There is more than a sufficient amount of time, allowing you to possibly enjoy a cup of coffee at Café Riche, an old Dutch coffee shop, if you so wish.
- You will then drive past the old **Synagogue**, where Nelson Mandela was tried for Treason.
- **Voortrekker Monument** – The solid shape of the Voortrekker Monument on a hill outside of the city, dominates the skyline towards the south-west. This monument is a tribute to the Voortrekkers (early pioneers) who brought with them, their western civilization, to the interior of South Africa, during the Great Trek. The Great Trek started in 1835/36 and eventually some 6000 white people (mainly stock farmers and their families) left for the interior of South Africa with all their possessions. These pioneers were of Dutch, German and French descent and some were of the 1820 Settlers from Britain. The dramatic events during the Trek (which culminated in the establishment of two independent states, in the interior of South Africa, in 1852 and 1854) and their way of life, is depicted in the frieze in the Hall of Fame in this monument. Your tour guide will explain each of the seventeen sculptured friezes in the Hall of Fame. This monument provides excellent photographic opportunities and offers you the chance to learn more about the "Afrikaner" and their culture.
- **The Melrose House Museum** – Melrose House is generally regarded as one of the best examples of the Late Victorian architecture in South Africa. It represents the way an affluent family, lived towards the end of the nineteenth century and it was designed for Mr George Heys, by a British architect, Mr W. T. Vale. Most of the furniture; carpets; silver; porcelain and household objects, were bought in the period between 1886 and the Anglo-Boer War, in 1899. The current appearance of the house is much as it was when used as a residence by the Heys family.

#### OR

- **Kruger House Museum** – The Kruger House was the home of Mr S. J. P. Kruger, President of the South African Republic, who lived here, with his family during the last sixteen years of the 19th century. The Museum bears witness to the forceful personality of Kruger, who was the leader of a small Boer-Republic in South Africa, who were engaged in a struggle against British Imperialism. The Museum consists of the original house, two display halls and Paul Kruger's State Railway Coach.
- **Transvaal Museum** – Among the city's numerous museums is, the Transvaal Museum. It is a natural history museum that houses, amongst others, a fascinating archaeological display and the Austin Roberts Bird Hall, with its extensive bird collection. **NOTE:** This museum will only be visited, if guests request visiting the museum at the time of the booking of the tour.
- **City drive** – We shall take you on an educational drive through the city. You will be able to see the City Hall and the Railway Station. We shall also take you on a scenic drive that encompasses embassies, beautiful parks and garden suburbs.

#### ITINERARY

- The declared area is 47 000 hectares and extends the most part of areas such as, Oaktree; Hekpoort; Broederstroom and Lanseria. Most of the site lies within Gauteng, with approximately 10% of the site within the North West Province. Most of the site is on Dolomite, a rock type which is slightly soluble in water. This has two major consequences - the formation of caves and the preservation of fossils.
- There are currently over 200 caves on the site, with a possibility that there are still more to be discovered. There are 13 fossil sites which have been extensively examined - and some have exposed fossils of human ancestors and their relatives. A variety of stone tools, used by our human ancestors, such as axes and scrapers have also been discovered and identified. The range of other creatures which co-existed in the area include: extinct animals such as short-necked giraffe, giant buffalo, giant hyaena and several species of saber-toothed cats. Numerous fossils of extant creatures such as leopards and hartebeest have also been found.
- There are a wide range of activities - perhaps the best known include Sterkfontein Caves and Maropeng. Both of these venues are suitable for children, but not easily accessible for the elderly or disabled (stair; bending; crouching and crawling are involved). In close proximity to the Wonder Cave is The Lion and Rhino Nature Reserve.
- Sterkfontein is one of the world's most productive and important anthropological sites and it is also a World Heritage Site. It is the place where Dr Robert Broom believed he had found the very first adult "ape-man," in 1936 and where, in 1947, a well-preserved skull of a female Plesianthropus was uncovered. The newspapers dubbed the skull Mrs. Ples. It is believed, by some scientists, to be the most complete skull of Australopithecus-Africanus that has been found to present date. Mrs. Ples is said to be about 2.7-million years old.

**INTRODUCTION:** The MAGALIESBERG CANOPY TOUR is a unique eco-adventure that takes clients on a 2,5 hour tour down the spectacular Ysterhout Kloof, set in the ancient Magaliesberg Mountains. Eleven platforms have been built against the cliffs and rock faces of the kloof and are joined by long steel cables that clients slide along to reach the next platform. Much like a "foefie" slide, the canopy tour essentially involves zigzagging down the kloof while stopping at each platform to admire the expansive views and surrounding ecology. The very rare King Cheetah was first bred here and similar success was achieved in breeding the Wild Dog, Brown Hyena, Blue Duiker, SuniAntelope and various species of vultures.
